The Food and Drug Administration recently released startling data that vaping increased nearly 80% among high school students and 50% among middle schoolers since last year. According to the FDA that means 3.5 million children were vaping in 2018, up from 1 million from 2017.¹

LTHS student discipline data confirms this national trend. Area elementary districts are experiencing similar spikes in student vaping use. In response, the Lockport Area Superintendent Consortium will be hosting an information night for parents and students on the dangers of vaping.
